- **Standard Scores:** Test developers calculate the statistical average based on the performance of students tested in the norming process of test development. That score is assigned a value. Standard scores and standard deviations are different for different tests. Many of the commonly used tests, such as the Wechsler Intelligence Scales, have an average score of 100 and a standard deviation of 15.
- Percentiles: These scores show how a student's performance compares to others tested during test development.
- **Z-Scores:** These scores range from +4 to -4 and have an average of zero. Positive scores are above average. Negative scores are below average.
- **T-Scores:** have an average of 50 and a standard deviation of 10. Scores above 50 are above average. Scores below 50 are below average.
- **Stanine Scores:** Stanine is a contraction of the term "standard nine." These scores range from one to nine and have an average of about 4.5.

WISC-IV - Full Scale IQs between 90 and 110 are considered within the "average range" (Mean IQ is 100).
